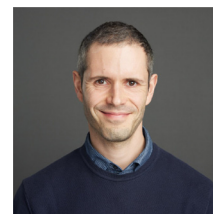


EDITORIAL

As such, it is natural for a reviewer to feel intimidated when faced with a review request, especially if the content of the article does not completely fall within their technical-scientific domain. This fellowship aims to provide initial experience to reviewers, and tools that allow them to carry out reviews in a systematic, complete and assertive way. The application process will be announced soon.

Finally, I would like to invite you all to CNR 2024, which will take place from the 8th to the 11th of May in Peniche. This CNR will be dedicated to the topics of Emergency and Oncology, which are certainly of interest to the entire Portuguese Radiological community.
